#### LOST ISLAND LUTHERAN CHURCH Annual Meeting Minutes January 26, 2020

Lost Island Annual Meeting was called to order at 10:45 a.m. on Sunday, January 26, 2020 by President Troy Leininger. 15 members of the congregation present.

Devotions by Pastor Peter Morlock were based on 1 Peter 2; Living Stones. It was noted that we are beginning our 7<sup>th</sup> year with Pastor.

Secretary's Report: after one correction of the spelling of Alaire Nielsen's name, Tim Nielsen made a motion to approve, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Alaire, motion carried.

No auditor report available at this time, Tim has the books available to anyone who wants to take a look. He will have Steve Pitt take a look when he returns from vacation.

Treasurer's Report: Tim reported that there is a surplus of \$11,000 due to our investments. Ended the year under budget on every line item. The council wrote off the final \$2,500 of Pastor Peter's truck loan as his bonus. Pastor sent around a Thank You note. Ron Kropf was paid for moving snow via credit at Ruthven Co-op Oil. Troy wanted the congregation to be aware that there are a couple large donors and should anything happen to them we could be in trouble financially. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report as presented by Alaire, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tom Mason. Motion carried.

President Report: Troy reminded the congregation that the council is still looking for goals for the congregation. He thanked everyone for their work this past year and that planning for the 150<sup>th</sup> will begin.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Peter reported that it had been a busy year, with everything going well. The synod elected a new bishop and it wasn't him! Synod Assembly will be in Spencer in early May and he asked for volunteers to be our representative. Troy indicated that he may be able to attend. The Bishop would like to visit the synod congregations, so if we would like her to come, we need to extend her an invitation sooner rather than later since her calendar does fill up. Confirmation is going well; Lost Island will confirm on November 1, 2020.

The 2020 Budget will increase by \$2,000; \$100 per month to Bethany for raises, \$100 to Custodian, upped IELC just in case electric rates increase and it was decided to just send the synod offering of \$3,500 to the synod instead of separating it to specific projects. Motion by Charles Henningsen to approve the budget as presented, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Alaire. Motion carried.

Celebration committee has started planning. Tim and Alaire met with John? who will be writing a piece of music for our celebration to give him information about the church and gave him Gladys's writings. He has ties to the area, so Tim is hoping he will attend our celebration. We do not need to pay him until next year, so please consider giving to this project. The committee will look into ordering shirts and Karyn Leininger will get the paperwork sent to start the process of a new cookbook. Pastor will meet with the committee to talk about special services, how many, when and who to include. Alan Oppedal asked about replacing the carpet. Troy mentioned needing to clean and/or replacement of the siding. Consensus was to keep an eye them. Tim checked on our big purchases and in 2001

painted the sanctuary and replaced the organ, 2002 replaced the roof, 2015 remodeled the basement and 2019 restored the stained glass windows.

Discussion turned to the possibility of an intern, Knutson's are working on the farm and would like to see Shirley's dream come to reality. Due to the weather the deadline for the application to Wartburg has been moved, Pastor has an application completed and ready to be submitted once he gets the go ahead. Cost is \$35,000. Lost Island is proposing to cover \$15,000 if Bethany can cover \$20,000. Due to the postponement of Bethany's annual meeting, we will revisit this topic after we know what Bethany decides. This is a cost over-and-above the approved budget, so Lost Island will have to discuss how to fund our portion.

At the church-wide meeting this past summer, changes were made to the basic constitution and it is recommended that we approve those changes. Karyn will review the changes and bring them to the congregation when we meet regarding the intern.

Worship committee reported that all are invited to attend their meetings, where they plan worship and asked for ideas.

The mission committee and Lakeside report were reviewed. Knutson's are asking for \$600/rent and will be getting a deck built this spring. The house does need some painting so we may put together a Thrivent project for that, watch for details.

VBS will be hosted at Lost Island on July 28-30th, 2020. Details will be coming.

Other Business: Bethany has hired a new secretary; Brittany Hernandez will start the week of January 27<sup>th</sup>. If you shop on Amazon, use Smile and choose Lost Island Lutheran Church and we will get a donation. Please direct your Thrivent dollars to Lost Island as well.

Motion to adjourn by Pastor Peter, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Pat Henningsen. Meeting adjourned @ 12:05 p.m.

Lost Island Lutheran will be 150 years old in 2022 and the committee will start initial plans to create a celebration that is worthy of the saints that came before us and gave us the foundation on which to grow into the congregation we are today. If you have some ideas on activities we can do, new ways to promote our festivities or simply want to lend a hand when it is needed, please let me, Pastor, Karyn or Tom know.

God is great and He is in control! I pray that we all are ready and have plenty of oil in our lamps when He calls us to action in 2021. I thank God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit for each of you and continue to be amazed at what we accomplish together.

#### **PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 2020**

If I had to pick a major theme for the year I might use the word Adaptability. We have faced a challenge unique to everyone here; a challenge that our churches haven't faced in a century or more. We have risen to the challenge and adapted. We have managed to do some of our normal things- both churches celebrated- affirmation of Baptism this fall, Sunday school and youth groups have continued, worship continues- but we have had to adapt how we do those things. Our online presence and use of technology has expanded greatly. We have made changes in our worship service, and the way we gather, and we have suspended the celebration of Communion in the service for the time being. We have adapted well to the changes we have had to make even when we don't like them, and we will continue to do so for the foreseeable future.

Some of these changes have been hard as we have temporarily postponed some beloved traditions, or adapted them, but I am grateful for your willingness to do so and your flexibility. These are gifts that other pastors in our synod do not have, as their congregations have become anxious and fearful for their future and reacted by taking it out on the pastor. We have chosen to listen, and be honest, and work together. I deeply appreciate that.

Reflection- All of that is a rather long and round about introduction to this reflection. In the last months we have had to think about and put into practice some new ways of being the Church. And we have discovered some flexibility in doing so. This has been the silver lining in all of the changes and adaptations we have had to make; some wonderfully creative ideas and practices have emerged. People are involved in ministries and outreach in ways they have not been before. In some ways we are recapturing an ancient idea of what it is to be church, especially when we cannot gather in our buildings in large groups. Folks are taking initiative for ministry and mission and finding new ways to study the Word together and be in worship together all while maintaining the necessary distance to slow the spread of COVID. I know it has not been easy some of the time. I also know that this is not our preferred way of doing things, but you have handled the changes and continued the ministry with great aplomb, and for that I am grateful. Many of my colleagues in and around the synod and the ELCA have not been so lucky. At the time of this writing there is light at the end of the tunnel with news of a couple vaccines that will hopefully achieve widespread use by sometime this summer. In the meantime we will continue to adapt as needed to the circumstances that present themselves. We will continue to BE the church in all the countless ways we have been, knowing that our foundation in Christ remains solid.

Conference and synod news- the conference bid farewell to Pastor Laurie Boysen at the beginning of January, leaving United and Nazareth without a Pastor. Kim Campbell and I, with the assistance of others will be providing Vacancy coverage until the Synod places an interim, which should not be more than a couple months. Synod Assembly will be a virtual affair on April 10th. We will still need voting members, but those folks will need access to zoom and perhaps other forms of technology. More information will be made available in the coming days. As we enter another year as Pastor and people, I remain grateful for our journey together and look forward to what the future will bring.

#### Things on my radar

Lost Island is preparing to celebrate 150 years of ministry in 2022, plans for that are in the works. The Rural Ministry Initiative with the Knutson farm is still on the burner. Conversations are ongoing with Wartburg Seminary for a possible intern, and Augsburg University in Minneapolis for ways to partner with their Theology and Public Leadership degree program. Possible uses for the RMI, apart from an intern include; Formation retreats, rural immersion experiences for students and other things- all aimed at introducing folks to the ministry and rural areas. I will keep you posted as these develop.

**Confirmation camp** – I am planning on confirmation camp with both classes for this summer, and assuming we will be able to do that. There are 10 students in the first year class and 3 in the second. I'm planning on taking them to Ingham Okoboji.

**Seminary field work-** continues with Kim Campbell. She has assisted with Confirmation instruction, and will shortly be undertaking worship leadership and preaching responsibilities as appropriate.

#### LAKESIDE PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

#### 2020

For fiscal year, through September 17, 2020

Covid-19 has been our most worrisome concern the last 6-7 months. As of today, we have had no positive test results in either staff or residents. We have spent over \$80,000 on personal protective equipment, as well as extra time and money on preparing for an outbreak or covering for staff sent home with worrisome symptoms. Fortunately, we have had 2 federal grants and a large loan through the Paycheck Protection Plan, which we believe will be eventually forgiven. So, financially, we remain in a satisfactory condition. We recognize the emotional stress the separation precautions cause our residents and their families, but we must comply with health regulatory agency requirements. The outdoor family and Zoom meetings have been well received. Our staff has been dedicated and diligent, and the Lakeside Board, on behalf of grateful families, has recently granted a bonus payment to our wonderful staff.

On other matters, we now have available senior independent living apartments, along with assisted living options. We continue timely payments on our loans and maintain a relatively low employee turnover rate. We have purchased a newer used resident transport van. We continue updating our facility with indoor and outdoor painting projects, a new whirlpool bath, several new lifts, and a gradual room renovation project. We are working on re-invigorating the Lakeside Foundation, and hopefully getting more contributions to further our room renovations.

As always, our chief concern is to maintain our excellence of care to our residents, and to fulfill our mission "as witnesses to God's love. . ." To do this, once again, we ask for your prayers and support.

#### Lakeside received several necessary updates this past Fiscal Year, which included:

#### **New Transportation and Equipment purchases included:**

- 2. New lifts and stands to assist with providing safe resident transfers
- 3. New whirlpool tub in the South spa room
- 4. An upgraded phone system for both Lakeside and Grace Estates

#### Other Important changes to note:

- 1. Board approval of Grace Estates at Lakeside as the official name of the Independent Living/Assisted Living
- 2. Board Approval adding an Independent Living apartment rental option, to include up to 4 apartments, available to individuals aged 55 years and older.

#### **Current Fiscal Year Administration Goals:**

- 1. Establish a Board for the Lakeside Foundation
- Create a Courtyard area in between the Assisted Living and Haven for both resident and tenant use
- 3. Increased marketing for the Lakeside Community
- 4. Increased census for Lakeside and Grace Estates
- 5. The development of a separate web site for Grace Estates

#### **Current Fiscal Year Maintenance Goals:**

- 1. New windows in resident rooms, with primary focus on the West Hallway
- 2. Purchase a new whirlpool tub for the North Spa Room
- 3. Finish the tin on the facia boards
- 4. Replace existing exit doors in the three lounge areas of each of the three halls
- 5. Replace the gazebo roof
